
Interesting Facts about Idaho & History:

- * On August 12, 1805, members of the Lewis and Clark expedition were the first white men to enter what is now Idaho and placed the first American flag into Idaho soil.
- * Idaho was the last state discovered by Europeans.
- * Assistance provided by the Shoshone and Nez Perce Indian tribes made it possible for the Lewis and Clark expedition to pass through Idaho.
- * <u>President Abraham Lincoln signed the act creating the</u> <u>Idaho Territory on March 4, 1863</u>. William Wallace, Idaho's first governor and later delegate to Congress, was invited by President Lincoln to attend Ford's Theater.
- * Idaho entered the Union as the 43rd state on July 3, 1890.
- * Kullyspell House, a trading post on the shores of Lake Pend Oreille, was the first building erected in Idaho in 1809.
- * The Cataldo Mission, near Kellogg, is the oldest building standing in Idaho. It was built in 1853.
- * The Great Seal of Idaho was designed in 1890 by Mrs. Emma Edwards Green, the only state seal designed by a woman.
- * The first alpine chairlift was used in Sun Valley in 1936. The fee was .25 cents per ride.
- * The "Craters of the Moon" National Monument presents a volcanic landscape that played a pivotal role in the first successful moon landing.
- * Henry's fork is arguably the single most proclaimed fly fishing trout stream in the United States.
- * Idaho lies halfway between the equator and the North Pole.
- * Idaho has five Native American tribes: Coeur d'Alene, Kootenai, Nez Perce, Shoshone-Bannock, and Shoshone-Paiute
- * Television was invented in Rigby, Idaho by Philo Farnsworth
- * Known as the Gem State, Idaho produces 72 types of precious and semi-precious stones, more than any other state.
- * Idaho is the number one producer of potatoes, barley, trout, Austrian winter peas and lentils.
