The first **Mesa Falls Marathon** had 11 runners, and Curt Judy drove all 11 up to the start of the race. There was also a relay but was dropped after two years and added the half marathon instead. This was also the time when Dennis and Jodi Aslett came on board and became the race directors for about 10 years. As the race progressed and grew the trail changed going from two miserable hills to only one. After this change, **Mesa Falls Marathon** gained a lot of compliments and raves over Mile14; in fact this spot was talked about so much that it gained attention from *Competitor Magazine* in Oct. 2010 with a write up about Mile 14, Mesa Falls Marathon, and Ashton.
